She is the daughter of Kamala Prasad Agarwala (politician, legislator and public representative) and Mina Agarwala (prominent women's rights activist of Assam and one of the prominent leaders of the Tezpur Mahila Samiti), and the niece of Jyoti Prasad Agarwala (noted Indian playwright, songwriter, poet, writer and film maker from Assam, regarded as the founder of Assamese cinema).
